Greetings Department of Maryland Sweet Treats;

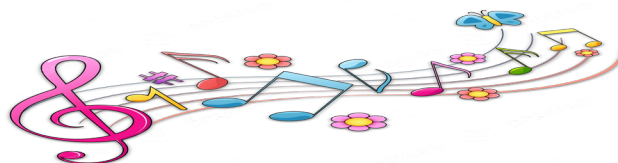

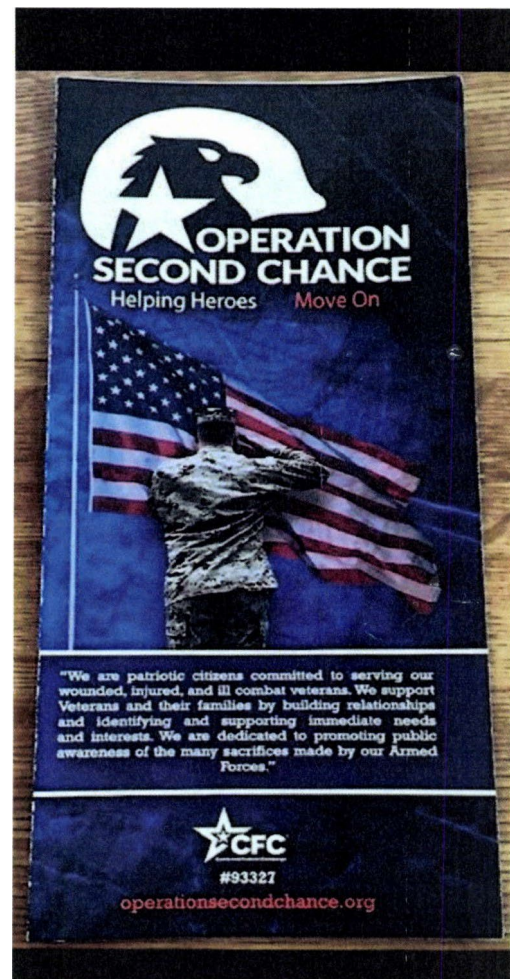
